REVIEW OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

- Class of 2025 has earned over 250 Industry
 Recognized Credentials during their time in CTE
- Examples: OSHA, Hot Work, CNA, CPR/First aid, Adobe, Automotive Lift, Radiology, Ladder Safety, ServeSafe, Viega ProPress, Cosmetology License, etc. With several programs earning hours towards licensure after graduation
- 29 CTE students earned the honor of becoming a member of the National Technical Honor Society -Criteria: 93 or above in CTE area and a 3.25 GPA in all classes
- The Culinary program continues to offer "grab & go" options one or two days a week, along with a monthly breakfast open to all Veterans in Somerville. Additionally, they prepare meals for Project Soup and the Somerville Homeless Coalition, and cater events for the school district. In collaboration with our Culinary team we will be open with dine in service to City Hall and Tab building staff on May 8th and June 10th.
- The Graphic Communications print shop remains busy throughout the school year, completing over 300 jobs and saving the city and local non-profit businesses more than \$250,000.

COOPERATIVE EDUCATION & AFFILIATIONS


We have 19 students currently in affiliation and 27 students participating in Cooperative Education, with 4 pending for the "Let's Get Working" program. Additionally, 67 students take part in "In-School Service Shops" open to the public. As a result, 91% of seniors are engaged in "live work," with 18 juniors pending paperwork for Cooperative Education. Furthermore, 117 out of 128 seniors are participating in Work-Based Learning.





Early Education and Care Program

- As part of the "Safe Routes to School" program, the Early Education and Care students conducted Pedestrian Safety Education sessions for all 2nd grade classrooms within the district
- These sessions include sidewalk safety, how to cross the street safely, as well as driveway & parking lot safety
- These sessions were done in collaboration with Somerville's Office of Food Access & Healthy Communities, MA Safe Routes to School Outreach, and the Early Education and Care program
- Two days a week, the 17 Sophomore students work in the afterschool program throughout the Elementary schools to gain experience with preschoolers





AUTOMOTIVE PROGRAM



- Automotive has been open daily and they complete on average 20-25 vehicles a week
- Completed services on over 200
 vehicles. These live jobs are saving
 the Somerville community members
 over \$100,000
- Second Chance CARS donates \$1,000
 to each school for senior awards




COSMETOLOGY SALON

BOSTON BRUINS/ BOSCH/ SHS






BOSTON BRUINS/ BOSCH/ SHS




