- Father of two SPS students

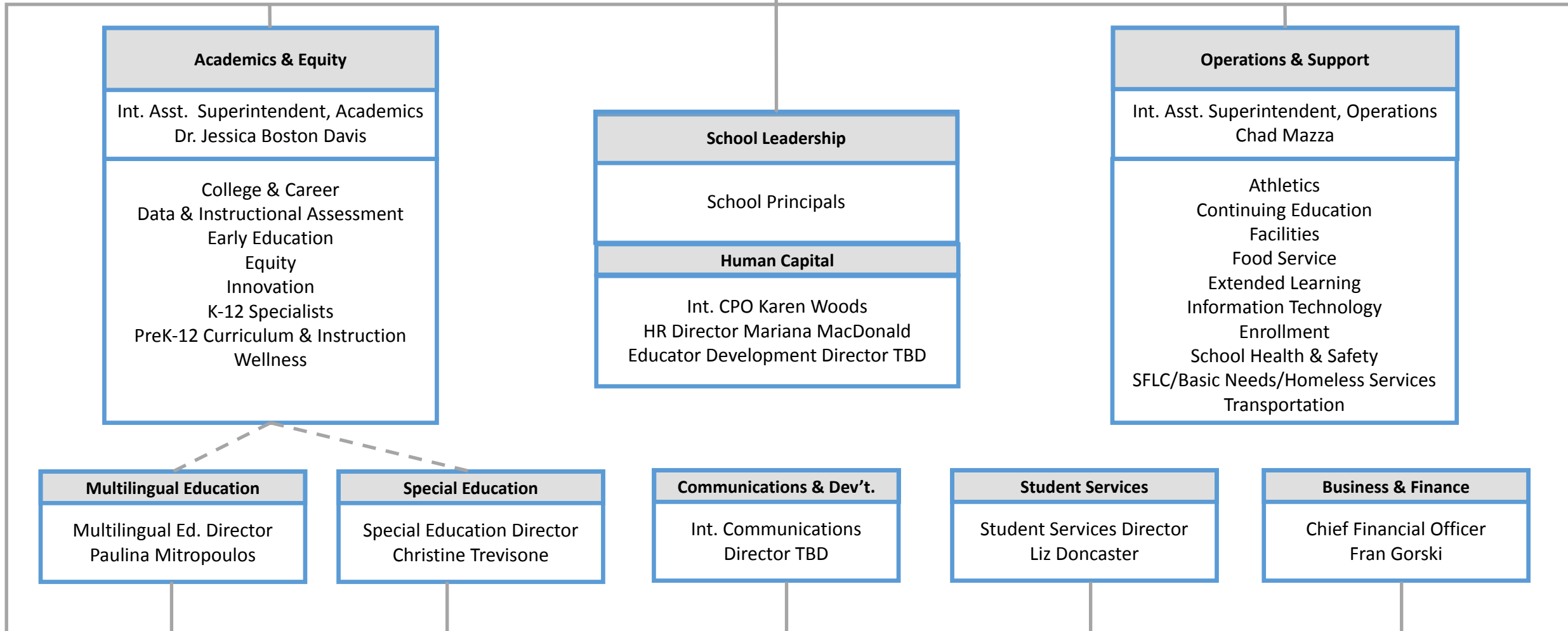
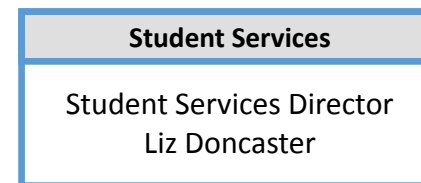
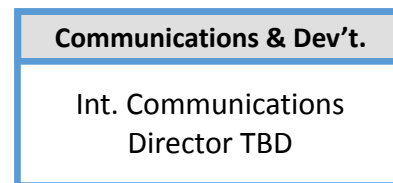
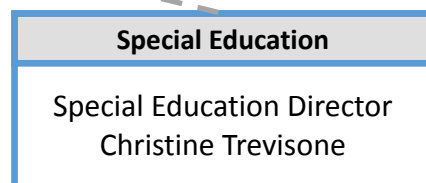
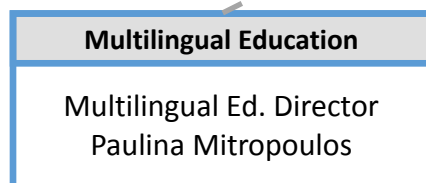
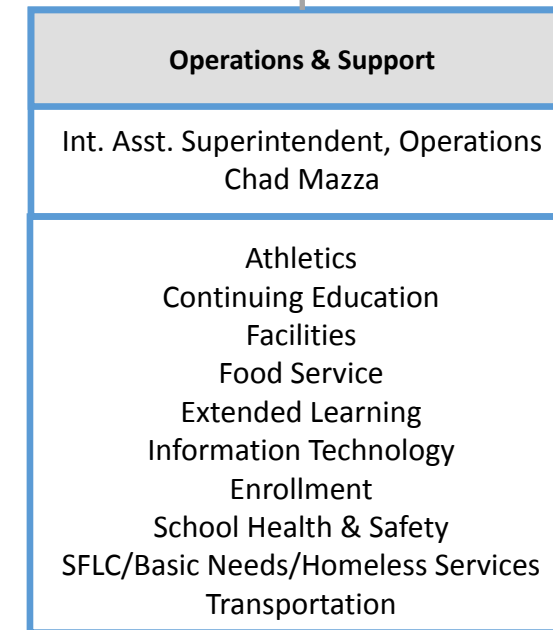
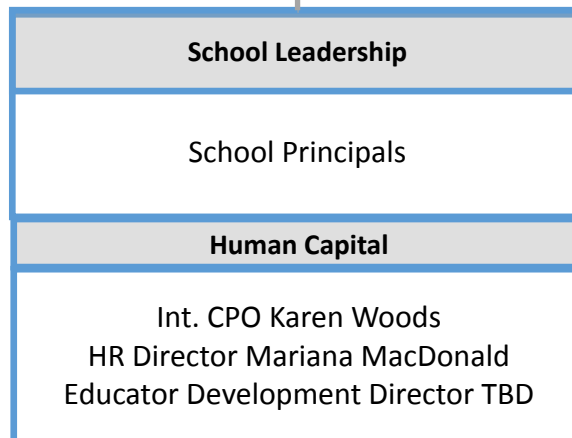
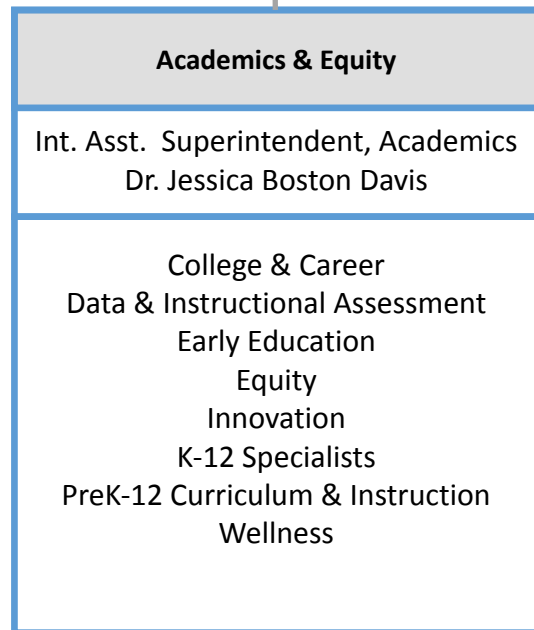
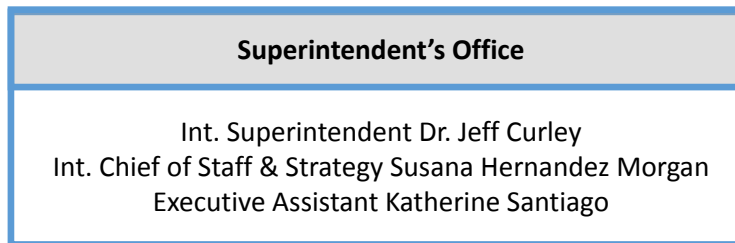
