COVID-19 Testing Protocol and Reminders

Our COVID-19 testing continues to go well. Our district [percent positivity rate remains between 0.1 and 0.2%](#). Students and staff should continue to follow COVID safety protocols outside of school and to check daily for any symptoms of COVID-19, including doing a temperature check each morning. If your child or someone in your household is showing symptoms, is in quarantine, or has COVID-19, it is important that you keep your child home and notify the school nurse, to avoid the risk of transmission. Thank you for your continued efforts and cooperation.

COVID-19 Vaccination Walk-in Sites and Pop-up Clinics

As of May 13, 2021, COVID-19 vaccines are available for anyone 12 years or older. Cambridge Health Alliance (CHA) offers walk-in vaccinations at three of their sites. Visit the [CHA COVID-19 website](#) to learn more. The City of Somerville Health and Human Services Department are also holding mobile COVID-19 vaccination clinics in partnership with CHA. Mobile vaccination clinic dates will be released as sites are confirmed, and are free, open to all people 12 years or older, regardless of immigration status or health insurance. Identification will not be required. Dates and locations will be listed at www.somervillema.gov/vaccine and will be announced via City vaccine alerts (by text, phone, and e-mail).
