Animal Experts at the Argenziano in Grade 1

Ms. Jane Campos' Grade 1 class at the Argenziano School recently did some impressive research. Each student chose a mammal, insect, or reptile as a project topic. They started their research in the library, finding source materials about habitats, diets, movement and important characteristics. One student proudly announced that their animal was a predator!

After developing a written presentation, the students worked with found materials to build sculptures of their research subject. They used materials like toilet paper rolls and strawberry boxes, then painted and added important detail. Ms. Campos invited parents to come in to see their students' projects, and to enjoy a performance of a poem about Martin Luther King, Jr.



West Somerville Neighborhood School's Fun Run a Great Success by Any Measure

The track lights lit up the school gymnasium and parents and teachers were on the sidelines to cheer for the students. The Boosterthon DJ played "Fill Me Up, Buttercup" and then "High Hopes" on the sound system in the corner. Last Friday, January 17 was West Somerville Neighborhood School's Fun Run.


The event not only raised funds for the school's PTA, it also promoted health and wellness and a strong sense of school community. In the week leading up to the Fun Run, students sought pledges toward each lap they ran in the gym. All tallied, the school community received pledges from all 50 states and 13 countries, and raised over \$30,000. The funds are used to pay for special assemblies and activities, and to defray the cost of offsite learning excursions such as the third graders' trip to visit Plimoth Plantation, the sixth graders' trip to Nature's Classroom, and the eighth grade trip to Washington, DC.

Winter Walk & Roll to School Day

On Wednesday, February 5th, Somerville students will be joining students across the Commonwealth in promoting wellness by walking or rolling to school in celebration of the 5th annual Massachusetts Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Winter Walk & Roll to School Day. Sponsored by the MA Department of Transportation, this annual event not only promotes healthy and active lifestyles, but also helps reduce the environmental impact in communities.

Schools across the district will be supporting the Winter Walk & Roll to School Day in a number of ways with some distributing stickers or other items promoting this annual SRTS event, cheering students on as they cross the "finish line" upon arriving to school, and inviting community partners and staff to attend and participate. In the past, several schools have also invited students who take the bus to take a few laps around the playground before heading to class.

Thanks to school wellness champions, Shape Up Somerville, school PTAs, school family and community liaisons, and other community partners who help coordinate and promote this event, Somerville students are "walking the walk" in support of healthy and active lifestyles.

Healey School Accepting Donations for Book Fair – through February 14, 2020

Book Fair News from the Healey! We decided to do something a little off the beaten path this year for our annual book fair. This year, we will accept gently used books from bookshelves all over Somerville to sell for our book fair.

Why? Our mission is to make sure every child in our school has access to age-appropriate books and can go home with a book, expanding their home library. This also helps parents clean out books their kids may have outgrown, which makes room for new books while lessening our carbon footprint. We also thought this was a great way to invite the larger Somerville Community to participate in the process. All the money raised will go back to Healey Families to help fund offsite learning opportunities and activities throughout the year.

Goal? Our goal is to collect a diverse selection of new or gently used books from the community (and publishers if anyone has connections!) and sell the books for \$1.00-\$5.00 a book. The goal is to make sure every child goes home with at least one book, regardless of their ability to pay. The hope is to collect 1,000 age-appropriate books for the Healey School's 438 students by February 14, 2020.

What we need: New or gently used children's books from all over Somerville; books for children in Pre-K through 8th grade; bilingual or dual language books; diverse characters in books, volunteers to help sort books and prepare the space for the book fair in late February.

What happens to the leftover books after the book sale? We have plans to keep books accessible for the kids all year round while also making sure books in good condition are not thrown away. We plan on constructing a little library (take a book/leave a book) for the first floor where we have books available to take for visitors and students year-round. Your old books can have a positive impact on kids and our community, so please consider donating your books at the Healey School's front desk, or see if your school has a donation box for Healey volunteers to pick up on February 14th. (Only new or gently used Pre-K-8 children's books can be accepted.)
