Review of Major Investments and Repairs

2020-2021

- Extensive work to improve ventilation and reduce COVID-19 transmission
- Examples varied by school: adjusting fan speeds, upgrading filters, installing humidifiers, disinfection bulbs, improvements to nurse's suites, portable air filtration

FY23 Budget - 10% increase in SPS Budget

- \$550,000 districtwide enrollment and space needs study
- \$300,000 new HVAC equipment and controls systems evaluation
- Ongoing investment in key positions: SPS Assistant of Superintendent of Operations, DPW Superintendent of Buildings, DPW Preventative Maintenance Manager, Deputy Director of Capital Projects

Summer 2022

Extensive maintenance and clean up work across schools; Ex. Met every request around Winter Hill

Phase 2: Gap Analysis & Cost Estimate (Funding Source: City general fund)	Summer 2023 - Winter 2023
Phase 3: Feasibility Study & Community Process (Funding Source: City general fund)	<mark>Winter</mark> 2023 - Fall 2025
Phase 4: Design (Funding Source: combination of City general fund and MSBA funding)	Starting Fall 2025 - 2026
Phase 5: Construction (Funding: MSBA funding & possible debt exclusion)Followi	ng design & funding approval

Phase 1A: Enrollment Study (SPS Lead)

Spring 2023

- Goal: SPS developing school enrollment forecasts
- Anticipating modest but steady growth
- Numbers necessary for any application to Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA)

Basic timeline:

- Early spring Preliminary results
- Spring Formal presentation to school committee
- June/July Final data informs gap analysis

Funding Source: SPS Funding

Phase 1B: Building Capacity Study (IAM Lead)

Spring 2023

- Goal: Understand capacity of post-1990's buildings and the renovation needs/potential of Brown & Winter Hill buildings
- Documentation necessary for any application to Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA)
- Funding Source: City general fund

Phase 2: Gap Analysis & Cost Estimate

Update: Summer-Fall 2023

- Study potential capacity of...
 - Existing buildings
 - Replacement school
- Compare to results of enrollment study:
 - What is the gap between current capacity and anticipated enrollment?
 - Do we renovate existing structures OR build new?
- Scope out the feasibility study
- Funding Source: City general fund

Phase 3: Feasibility Study & Community Process

Update: Winter 2024 - Fall 2025

- Submit MSBA statement of interest
- Form a building committee
- Conduct feasibility study with community input
- Explore financing options with approval from City Council and/or voters
- Funding Source: City general fund

Phase 4: Design

Starting 2025 - 2026

- Create design
- Funding Source: Combination of City general fund and MSBA funding

Phase 5: Construction

Following design & funding approval

- Dependent upon completion of all antecedent tasks, MSBA funding and local funding approval
- Funding source: MSBA funding & possible debt exclusion

Areas for Family/Community Involvement

- Building Committee convene Summer 2023
 - Typical composition
- Feasibility study involves community engagement
 - Ex. Similar process for SHS

Factors Beyond Our Control

- MSBA core process and timeline a lot of volatility across the state
- Supply chain issues
- Fluctuating/high construction costs
- Interest rates

Timelines may change
